## 7. Initiative Towards Faculty Development Programme :

Kurve deliver the lecture on “How to prepare research project & where to submit”. During the programme all the faculty members were present & they got the knowledge of writing the major and minor research project & get acquainted very well with the details of it.
- Under Health Care centre sugar check-up of all the teaching & non-teaching staff of the college were undertaken on 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> April 2012. On this occasion a renowned pathologist of Gondia city checked the blood samples of the staff members & report was made. Besides, she also delivered a lecture on causes & symptoms of blood sugar.
- A lecture on “Effects of Hormones in our Body” was organized by Department of Chemistry on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2012. On this occasion renowned pathologist Dr. Manisha Mishra delivered effectively important role played by Hormones in our body. She very well elaborated the importance and the ill effects of hormonal imbalances.

### iii) Magazines :

**iv) Journal :**

**23. Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback :**

Primary goal of this committee is to help the students who are from financially weaker section of the society. Main source of our feeding is the rural area and those students are found having the problems like-

- (a) They are financially weak & cannot buy books.
- (b) They are sometimes not able to pay for the monthly bus pass.
- (c) They are not able to pay the tuition fees of the college.
- (d) Buying the college uniform is difficult for them.

When the session starts, Principal addresses the meeting of students & directs them to meet the committee members. The committees members then provides the available facilities to them. . The aims of this committee are –

- Providing books to students from Book Bank.
- Providing Questions Banks.
- Financial help for bus pass.
- Financial help for purchasing college uniform.
- Help for paying the tuition & admission fees.
- Special help for physically challenged students.
